'WATER FOR LIFE' UN-WATER BEST PRACTICES AWARD

The 'Water for Life' UN-Water Best Practices Award was established in 2010 and launched for the first time in December 2010 during the International Conference 'Sustainable Water Management in Cities: engaging stakeholders for effective change and action, Zaragoza, Spain.

The purpose of the Award is to promote efforts to fulfill international commitments made on water and related issues by 2015 through recognition of outstanding best practices that can ensure the long-term sustainable management of water resources and contribute to the achievement of internationally agreed goals and targets contained in the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), Agenda 21 and the Johannesburg Plan of Implementation.

The Award was established by UN-Water and is organized by United Nations Office to Support the International Decade for Action "Water for Life" 2005-2015/UN-Water Decade Programme on Advocacy and Communication (UNW-DPAC) and the UN World Water Assessment Programme (WWAP). The Prize is awarded in two categories, one in 'best water management practices' and another one in 'best participatory, communication, awareness-raising and education practices'.

The Award is open to projects or programmes achieving particularly effective results in the field of water management or in raising awareness in water issues.

Every year, special emphasis is being put on the theme selected for next World Water Day.
